Objectives and activities

Summary of the objects of the charity set out in its governing document

The aims of the Pre-school are to enhance the development and education of children primarily under statutory school age by encouraging parents to understand and provide for the needs of their children through community groups and by: (a) offering appropriate play, education and care facilities, family learning and extended hours groups, together with the right of parents to take responsibility for and to become involved in the activities of such groups, ensuring that such groups offer opportunities for all children whatever their race, culture, religion, means or ability; (b) encouraging the study of the needs of such children and their families and promoting public interest in recognition of such needs in the local areas; and (c) instigating and adhering to and furthering the aims and objects of the Pre-School Learning Alliance.

The trustees have had regard to the guidance issued by the Charity Commission on public benefit.

The Lenches Pre-School operates during term time only and is based in Church Lench Village Hall. It offers appropriate play, education and childcare facilities to families in the Lenches and wider area, but also attracts children and families from the towns of Evesham and Pershore.

The setting is located in some of the most beautiful countryside in Worcestershire and the children have access to a secure outdoor play area.

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

Achievements and performance

Children: Pre-school had 7 children on roll in September and 17 children in July. In July, 4 children left to go to school, 1 of which joined Church Lench First School. Recruitment of new children was restricted at the start of the academic year given the setting's "Inadequate" rating. An "inadequate" setting is unable to take on any new children other than children it has taken enquiries from.

Operational hours: Pre-School opened Monday to Friday in term time. No dedicated Forest School was offered on Mondays due to the lack of qualified Forest School Leader. Pre-School continued to offer 'Nature Walks' and to access the community orchard and local play area.

Ofsted rating "Good": The new Manager (appointed September 2022) — a qualified teacher and business owner — oversaw pre-school's regrading to "Good" in December 2022. The inspector praised the improvements made by the staff and the report outlines children who "make good progress in their learning and development." Staff are reported to "interact well with the children and provide a range of activities and experiences, indoors and outdoors. Children are confident, chatty and adopt a positive attitude to learning".

Focus on Grant Applications: In light of the cost-of-living crisis, the Committee prioritised grant applications over fundraising initiatives, and Pre-school was fortunate to secure two significant charitable grants, totalling £3,291.

Further collaboration with Church Lench First School: While Pre-School and Church Lench First School have always enjoyed strong links, this was furthered in April 2023 when the settings cooperatively organised a Forest School at Yates' Community Orchard for the community. A large number of local families enjoyed this event and it also led to a number of applications for places in September 2023.

The Lenches Pre-school has historically targeted a reserve fund of £50k to cover potential costs including closure, securing operations (such as recruitment fees), new equipment and professional fees (approved 23/4/2018). There is no documentary evidence of this having changed.

The Lenches Preschool reported a loss of £18.5k in AY23.

This was due to the low number of children on roll which led to a significant decrease in income and is directly attributed to the impact of the setting's Ofsted rating downgrade which prevented the recruitment of new children.

Pre-school is not immune to generic inflationary cost pressures but as is the case with the sector, it faced increases in minimum wage rates with no comparable increase in Nursery Education Funding rates. Recruitment of new staff proved challenging and Pre-school engaged a recruitment agency, further increasing costs.

The Committee is optimistic for an improved financial outlook in AY24.
